Objective: Use of semi-permanent adhesive tape on daggerboard

Proposal (include current & proposed changed wording- changes to be shown in red):

Class Rules, C8.4 (a) 7) says "Painted in a contrasting colour and on port and starboard sides".

Proposed wording: "Taped or painted in a contrasting colour and on port and starboard sides."

It is the same wording than that for the limit bands of the mast.

Reasons:

There exist tapes that are semi-permanent. In the case it is wanted to be removed, it has to be destroyed. This type of tape is already used for the limit bands of the mast. The use of tape for the daggerboard band makes easier setting the band for measurers and sailors and it is very visible and durable. It also has the advantage of being very fast to apply. It is as durable as the best painted solution and much more than the widely used permanent marker solution.
